Special Olympics Maine Unified Champion Clubs at the Alfond Youth & Community Center (AYCC) is a program that provides people with (athletes) and without (partners) intellectual disabilities the opportunity to play on the same team through recreational sports and activities in a community setting (i.e. YMCA's, Boys & Girls Clubs, Parks & Rec, etc.). A Unified partner is a student, or a community member without an intellectual disability, who actively participates with the athletes in a fun and meaningful way through recreational sports and activities at the AYCC. Unified partners and athletes form friendships and build community.
